The PLL will also support the full year academic & mentoring program that the nonprofit runs to give their students an opportunity to achieve success in the classroom, build their life skills, and become community leaders. Bronx Lacrosse is based around a model that is school-based, where students in the program are led by their on-site Program Coordinator, who tutors, mentors, and runs the lacrosse programming for its students.

"In only three years, it's inspiring to see the growth of Bronx Lacrosse under the leadership of Dan Leventhal," said Mike Rabil, co-founder and Chief Executive Officer of PLL. "Launching a program from scratch, from collecting gear to financing travel is no small task, especially in the poorest congressional district in the country.
